A Brief History of the World Hellenic Biomedical Association



The Hellenic Diaspora is one of the most populous worldwide and though having significant heterogeneities and a wide geographical distribution, has retained a sense of identity and culture that has allowed a sense of internal cohesion and unity with itself and a connection with its origins.

In terms of Hellenes studying and practicing medicine, this was noted even from the 17th century, with scholars diligently pursuing knowledge at the newly formed medical centres and schools of continental Europe. This has continued not only unabated, but with increasing numbers in the 20th century and particularly the last few decades, with signifi-

cant concentrations in the United States of America and Australia. Though the factors leading to this are not clear, it is perhaps due to the increasing scholarly orientation of Hellenes born out of as well as within Greece.

Following synods in 1882 and 1887, the First Panhellenic Medical Conference took place May 1901, in Athens. Even at that time, when transportation was less facile, over a fifth of the participants were from outside the geographical bounds of Greece at the time, including mainland Europe.

Concurrently, the medical and budding biomedical research communities, also begun to self-organise in their local areas. One first such example is the Hellenic Medical Society of New York, which was formed in an early instantiation in 1920 and has continued to bring together

members to serve the needs of the community. These local societies had at first more of a social, fraternizing aim, but later developed a more specialised interest in the particular needs of this subgroup of the wider Hellenic community.

The World Hellenic Biomedical Association was formally brought into being during the First International Biomedical Conference of the Hellenic Diaspora held in Athens, May 1990. The contacts for societies and individuals worldwide were collected and compiled by the Hellenic Medical Society of the United Kingdom, jointly organising the conference with the Athens Medical Society, with participants across the globe. It has been repeated successfully biannually in Athens for the first 3 times and later in New York and Cyprus also.

This Newsletter is the official publication of the World Hellenic Biomedical Association. It is published 3 times a year and it includes all the latest news of the Association. We hope you find it useful and interesting. Any suggestions for future topics will be appreciated.

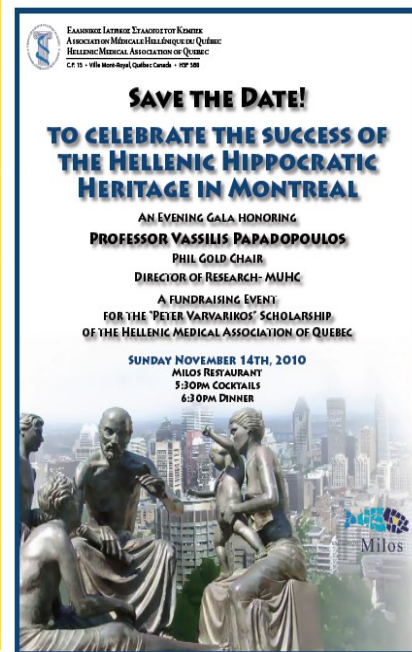
